Psoriatic disease, which includes both psoriasis and psoriasis arthritis (PsA), is a chronic, painful, disfiguring and disabling NCD, without a cure	There is a need for policymakers to address treatment access issues for those with psoriatic disease	Individuals with psoriatic disease experience stigma and discrimination	Psoriasis is connected to PsA and increases the risk of various co-morbid diseases	Psoriatic disease can lead to immense, needless suffering due to insufficient access to healthcare.
